THE AWARDS

The GOOD DEED AWARDS will be presented to as many as twenty individuals. Each award carries with it a prize of one of the following categories: 1st Prize \$350: 2nd Prize \$250: 3rd Prize \$150: 4th Prize \$100: There will be a total of FIVE awards of each of the four prizes. Certificate of Award \$25. There will be TWENTY winners in this category.
